Language of teaching	English and Finnish. Information on courses held in English can be found in the <i>Into portal</i> .
What can you study	Please check the information in the <i>School's web page</i> . You can also browse course information in the <i>WebOodi</i> portal.
Language courses	Exchange students may take language courses subject to availability and prerequisites. Please note that especially English language courses may be very full and Aalto's degree students are given priority to these courses. The Language Center also offers Finnish language and culture courses for international students.
Grading scale	Number grades from 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest), 0 = fail. Some courses have pass/fail grading.



The scope of the courses is given in ECTS (= European Credit Transfer System) credits. One credit corresponds to 27 hours of work, includ- ing lectures and other forms of instruction, exercises, seminars and in- dependent work, for example, at home and in the library. The scope of a course can be 1-15 credits depending on the content.
Exchange students are expected to study full time while at Aalto and to pass the courses with good grades. Full workload at Aalto is 30 ECTS credits per semester.
Two thirds of the engineering courses chosen must be from the School of Electrical Engineering, so one third of the courses can be taken from the three other Aalto schools of technology (School of Engineer- ing, School of Science and School of Chemical Engineering) as long as the student fulfills the prerequisites. However, exchange students in the School of Electrical Engineering (or other Schools of technology) cannot choose courses from the School of Art, Design and Architec- ture or the School of Business, except for <i>Aalto cross-school courses</i> that are offered to all Aalto students. In addition, there is a <i>selection of</i> <i>interdisciplinary courses</i> available for exchange students.
Yes. Please note that the majority of courses offered in English are in the master level. Bachelor-level students may take master-level courses if they fulfill the prerequisites. Aalto University strongly recom- mends at least 2, preferably 3 years of bachelor's studies before arriv- ing at Aalto.
<ul> <li>A thesis</li> <li>We can never guarantee final project placement for exchange students, and Aalto's own degree students are given priority, but we do our best to provide placement. Placement depends on the student's level and background as well as on the resources and research interests of the Department the student is interested in. Final project must be mentioned in the study plan when applying.</li> <li>Students who wish to complete a final project of 30 ECTS have to apply either for the spring term or for the full academic year. The autumn term in Aalto University is not long enough for completing a final project of 30 ECTS. Students must write and submit their project at Aalto. Application deadlines	<ul> <li>April 30: Applicants for the whole academic year or for the autumn term.</li> <li>October 15: Applications for the spring term only.</li> <li>Late or incomplete applications will not be handled after the deadline.</li> </ul>
Language requirements	<ul> <li>Exchange students from partner universities:</li> <li>Language of instruction at home university is English: No certificate needed.</li> <li>Language of instruction at home university is other than English: Certificate from an English language teacher or other professor, or an official language test certificate. At least B2 on CEFR scale.</li> <li>Students who wish to complete a final project should have C1-level English skills on the CEFR scale. If the level is B2 or lower, School of Electrical Engineering reserves the right to reject the application due to insufficient language skills.</li> </ul>
Application method	Aalto uses an online application system. Please see the page <i>How to apply</i> for more details.
Application results	Information about the application result will be sent within approxi- mately one and a half month after the application deadline.
Can students extend their exchange period?	In certain cases, yes. Student Services should be contacted as early as possible for processing the extension application.
How do students get the o	official
transcripts after the exchange?	Students can order an official digitally-signed transcript of records from WebOodi. The electronic transcript of records is a PDF document equipped with a digital signature to confirm its authenticity and integ- rity.
